

CHAINS - Crochet or Knit




Materials

DK yarn: Small amounts of plain or multicoloured yarn.
Large eye sewing needle
4mm crochet hook
OR any thickness yarn with appropriate size crochet hook.

Instructions

Chain 31
Row 1: Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Dc in each stitch to end (30 dc). Chain 1 to turn.
Repeat this row 5 times more.
Fast off.
Join ends linking chains as you go.



Materials

DK yarn: Small amounts of plain or multicoloured yarn.
Large eye sewing needle
Pair of 4mm knitting needles (old size UK 8)
OR any thickness yarn with appropriate size needles.

Instructions

Cast on 30 stitches.
Knit 6 rows.
Cast off.
Join ends linking chains as you go.



Knitting Chains to mark Anti-Slavery Day

The idea is to knit or crochet as many links of chain as you can to add to a long chain to mark Anti-Slavery Day (Sunday 18th October in 2022) and help raise awareness of modern slavery.

This initiative, started by the Mothers' Union, is now being supported by other community groups, individuals and organisations, such as Townswomen's Guild, who are keen to take part and are united in a desire to end modern slavery.
