Report of AGM at Cheltenham Racecourse 12th June 2019

This AGM was a very special event for Gloucestershire, a once in a lifetime opportunity. Members from the Federation provided a team of 9 stewards under the guidance of Hazel Tudgay produced a united front in their dress portraying TG members of 1929. This being our 90th Anniversary the membership was invited to dress in outfits of the 1920's and the response was magnificent. Our team performed an excellent job and I personally am very proud of us all. The total number attending from our Federation was 65 which again is an amazing achievement.

As I was the Banner Carrier and in Pole position No1 being only No2 to Princess Anne as Margaret Woodward pointed out. It is a proud moment to have the honour of carrying our banner and the cheers that went up when I entered the stage was very heart warming.

Special guests were The Princess Royal, Gloucestershire Lord Lieutenant Edward Gillespie, The High Sheriff of Gloucester and Roger Whyborn Cheltenham Mayor. National Anthem was sung. A loyal message was sent to the Queen and a reply received.

Two new guilds have been formed Callow and Coventry University. Janice Collins Vice-Chairman read the Mandate.

Mandate: TG calls on HM Government to require medical staff, police and other relevant agencies to inform the DVLA if an individual's health is reducing their ability to drive safely.

Proposed by Val Burgess 2nd by Sheila Alan. Nick Lloyd from ROSPA gave a for and against the proposal.

He felt that the current position is confusing for both the public and professionals, resulting in people driving with a notifiable medical condition. Against the mandate He felt trust which is an essential part of Doctorpatient relationship and confidentiality is central to this. Patients would not visit GP. Evidence could be counterproductive, another burden on Doctors.

Many members joined the debate with personal stories some quite horrific. A vote was taken, and a large majority were for the Mandate and it was carried.

Awards were presented by The Princess Royal

The TG award was given to Karen Moore Sedgley Guild. The ABC award was given to Prue Chadderton from Lincoln Minster Guild for her work over 16 years with Lincolns Women's Aid.

It was noted that Totnes Guild still functioning after 89 years (amazing)

The Princess Royal was asked to give a few words. Her retort was that after 90 years you would have to expect more than a few words. She was hugely impressed with our efforts to dress for the occasion.
