

## Seaside yarn bombing – crochet patterns

Abbreviations (UK terms)

ch	chain
dc	double crochet
htr	half treble
tr	treble
hdtr	half double treble crochet
dtr	double treble
ttr	triple treble
slst	slip stitch

Double knitting yarn and 4mm hook were used for the examples, but any yarn available can be used if the size of the hook is adjusted.

Eyes can be glued in place using a hot glue gun, sewed on or embroidered on.

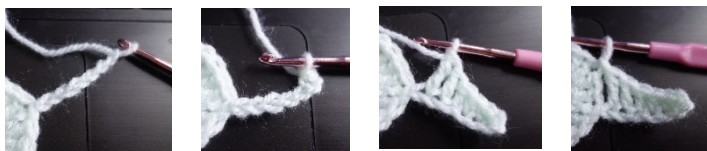
Make 2 bodies for each and sew or crochet them together, stuffing them slightly so that they are firmer when displayed.

This is not exact crochet, so adapt and use the patterns as you wish and don't worry about the number of stitches you use at any point

### Fish

**Body** make 2

- **Foundation** Chain 2, dc 6 in first chain (or dc 6 in magic circle), slst into first dc to join
- **Row 1** ch2, tr into same stitch, 2tr into each dc of foundation slst to join
- **Row 2** ch 2, (2tr in next stitch, tr in following stitch) round row 1, slst to join
- **Row 3** ch2, tr in same stitch, 2tr into each stitch of row 2, slst to join
- **Row 4** ch1, dc into next st.
- **Tail** Chain 7, and work back along the chain. Dc in second chain from hook, then work along chain 2 htr, 2tr, dtr
- Join to 3<sup>rd</sup> st along circle



- Repeat for other half of tail
- Dc round rest of circle, sl st to join  
Join bodies together
- **Top fin** join yarn approx. 3 st from tail fin. Work away from tail along stitches tr, tr, 2tr in same stitch 2 dtr in same st, 2 hdtr in same stitch, tr, tr

## Octopus

- Work as body of fish row 1 and 2
- **Row 4** Ch1, dc into next st  
**Legs** Ch 6. Dc in second chain from hook. Work dc back along the chain; join to next st along circle.  
Ch 7 and dc back  
Ch 8 and dc back  
Ch 9 and dc back  
Ch 9 and dc back  
Ch 8 and dc back  
Ch 7 and dc back  
Ch 6 and dc back  
Continue dc in each stitch round rest of body



Make second body but without legs and join bodies together, stuffing slightly.

## Jellyfish

- Work as body of fish row 1 to 3 BUT **do not** slst to join in foundation or any other row so it forms a semi-circle
- **Tentacles.** Start in the centre of the straight side and working outwards,  
Ch10 and dc back  
Ch 9 and dc back  
Ch 8 and dc back  
Ch 7 and dc back  
Join yarn and cut  
Starting in the centre of the straight side and working the other way outwards,  
Ch10 and dc back  
Ch 9 and dc back  
Ch 8 and dc back  
Ch 7 and dc back  
Continue dc in each stitch round rest of body



Make second body but without tentacles and join bodies together, stuffing slightly.

## Crab

- Work as body of fish row 1 to 3
- Row 4 ch1, dc into next st

### **Legs**

Ch 4 and dc back

ch 5 and dc back

ch 6 and dc back

Dc in next 3 stitches

### **Claw**

Ch 9, dc back 4

Ch 4, dc back to body

Join to next st

Dc round to where you want the other claw and legs and repeat



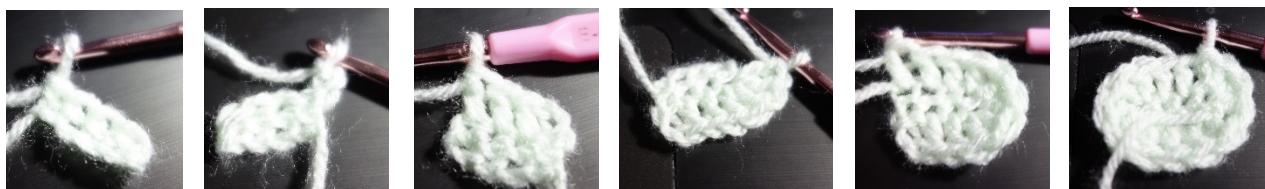
Continue dc in each stitch round rest of body

Make second body with claws and join bodies together, stuffing slightly. Join the claws by using a running stitch along the centre

## Crab 2

If you want a more oval crab, start with a different foundation

- **Foundation** ch 5, dc back along chain
- **Row 1** ch 2, tr each dc of foundation with 3 tr in each end to form an oval, slst into first dc to join



Work rows 2 and 3 as for the round crab but continue the oval shaping by using (2tr, 3tr, 2tr) in the 3 stitches at each end, Work row 4 and finish as for the round crab.

## Seahorse

**Head** make 2

- Work as for body of fish row 1 and 2
- **Row 3** Ch1, dc into next st  
**snout** Ch 5 and dc back

Continue dc in each stitch round rest of body

Join together

**Body** make 2

- Work as body of fish row 1 to 3
- **Row 4** Ch1, dc into next st  
**tail** Ch 20 and dc back

Continue dc in each stitch round rest of body

Join together and stitch tail into a circle

Join head and body

**Head fin.** Join yarn opposite the snout and work up the head.

Dc, dc, htr, 2tr in same stitch

**Back fin.** Join yarn and work up the body.

Dc, 5 dtr in same stitch, dc



## Starfish

**Body** make 2

- **Foundation** Chain 2, dc 10 in first chain (or dc 10 in magic circle) slst into first dc to join
- **Row 1** ch 2, tr into same stitch, 2 tr into each dc of foundation, slst to join

**Row 2 Legs**

- Ch 9 and work back dc x 2, htr x 2, tr x 2, dtr x 2
- Join to 4<sup>th</sup> stitch on along body
- Make 4 more legs in the same way

**Row 3**

- Dc round the legs, 3dc in same stitch at end of each leg

Join bodies together, stuffing slightly.



**Shell** make 2

- **Foundation** Chain 2, 3dc, 3htr in first chain  
(or 3dc, 3htr in magic circle)



slst into first dc to join



- **Row 1** ch2, htr into same stitch, 2htr into next 2 stitches, 2 tr into next 3 stitches do not join but carry on working in the same direction to make a spiral



2 tr into next 3 stitches  
2 htr into next 6 stitches  
2 dtr into next 6 stitches

- **Row 2** dc in each stitch around shell, join with slst
- **Row 3** ch1, dc in next stitch, 2 dc in following stitch, around the shell

Sew shells together, stuffing slightly.

## Mermaid

### **Body and tail** make 2

- **Foundation** Chain 2, dc 6 in first chain (or dc 6 in magic circle), slst into first sc to join
- **Row 1** ch 1, 2 dc in each stitch round, slst to join
- **Row 2** ch 2, (2tr in next stitch, tr in following stitch) round row 1, slst to join
- **Row 3** ch 1, 2 dc in each stitch round row 2, slst to join
- **Row 4** dc, chain 11 and work back dc x 2, htr x 2, tr x 2, dtr x 2, ttr x 2 Join to 6<sup>th</sup> stitch along Dc round rest of circle, slst to join



### **Tail fins** make 2

- Ch 7 and work back dc x 2, htr, tr, htr, dc x 2
- Join to end of tail

### **Bodice** make 2

Find the stitch in the top of the circle opposite the tail and join yarn 2 stitches to one side of it

#### **Row 1** Dc 5

#### **Row 2 and 3** dc

Run the thread along the top and pull to make it narrower for the neck

Join bodies and tails

### **Arms** make 2

- Ch 12 and work dc back
- Fold in half lengthways and join to bodice

### **Head** make 2

- **Foundation** Chain 2, dc 6 in first chain (or dc 6 in magic circle), slst into first dc to join
- **Row 1** ch 1, 2 dc in each stitch round, sl st to join
- **Row 2 and 3** ch 1, (2dc in next stitch, tr in following stitch) round row 1, slst to join
- **Row 4** dc in each stitch round, sl st to join
- Join together and join to the body

## Sew features and add hair

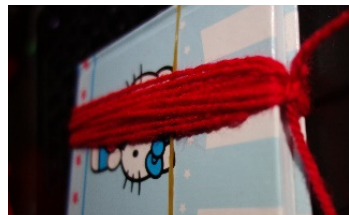
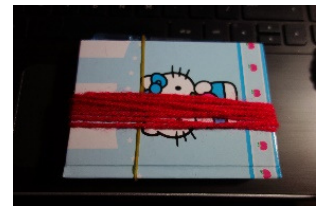
**Nose** Use a round headed pin to decide where you want the nose. Push the needle up to one side of where you want the nose the nose. Pull the yarn through. Go to where you want the other side of the nose. Push the needle down and pull the yarn through. Repeat 3 or 4 times until you have the size nose you want. Then push the needle through to the back of the head to finish it.

**Eyes** Do as for the nose but use a finer yarn or embroidery floss. Use 2 round headed pins to decided where you want the eyes.

**Hair** Decide how long you want your mermaid's hair. Find a heavy piece of card or book twice the length you want the hair. Wrap your yarn loosely around it about 20 times.

Either cut the yarn at one end and sew each strand to the head individually

Or tie the strands together before you cut the yarn, cut it and sew it on as a 'wig'



Arrange and sew it in place like a pony tail to cover the back of the head
